#### MID-YEAR GENERAL MEETING AND MEETING WITH THE CHIEF MINISTER

- 9. Frepenca's Mid-Year General Meeting ("MYGM") was held in a hybrid way on 27 August 2020 due to the Covid-19 situation. Only the Committee Members were required to be present in person at MYGM held at PSDC Building. Other Non-Committee Members were not required to be present in person but joined MYGM virtually.
- 10. The Meeting with the Chief Minister was not held subsequent to the Meeting but was deferred to 27 October 2020 due to the Covid-19 situation. Some of the issues raised at the Meeting with the Chief Minister on behalf of the Members by the Committee Members were as follows:
  - a) Follow up on the action items arising from the Dialogue with the CM held on 26 August 2019;
  - b) Update on Penang Transport Master Plan;
  - Next industrial area in Penang;
  - d) Entry permission application for expatriates;
  - e) Freeze on new intake of foreign workers until year-end;
  - f) Renewal of Leases on Industrial Land in Penang FIZ; and
  - g) Presentation of plans by Frepenca to Penang State Government.

#### **CUSTOMS**

11. The Customs Convenor continued to attend meetings convened by the Customs Department and any new Customs procedures and regulations are then communicated to members.

#### **SECURITY**

12. The Security Sub-Committee continues to hold regular meetings to discuss security issues affecting companies in the FIZ.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES**

13. The Human Resources Convenor set up a WhatsApp Group Chat called "FIZ HR/KKM BD" in order to have better and faster collaboration, communication and engagement between FIZ HR fraternity and South West District Health Office, Penang ("KKM BD") in tackling and overcoming the Covid-19 pandemic. Included in the said Group Chat is Dr. Thava Viknaraj Sivabalan, Pegawai Kesihatan dan Perubatan of KKM BD who leads the task force fighting Covid 19 in Barat Daya. The said Group Chat's participation is also open to all Members' EHS/DOSH Officers following Frepenca's discussion with KKM BD. Subsequently, the said Group Chat's name was changed to "FIZ HR/KKM Collab" as Health Officers from other Penang Districts were also invited to join the said Group Chat.

#### ANNUAL SURVEY

14. Frepenca conducts surveys annually instead of quarterly with effect from 2020 on its member companies in order to obtain data on business trends, headcount of employees, environment, power and water interruptions and traffic congestion affecting members. Members are encouraged to support these surveys so that more accurate data can be obtained.

15. At the Annual General Meeting on 25 February 2021, your Committee will propose that subscriptions for 2021 be fixed at RM2,000 for the year.

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE FREE INDUSTRIAL ZONE, PENANG, COMPANIES' ASSOCIATION (FREPENCA)

#### Report on the Audit of the Accounts

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the accounts.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

#### 1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The accounts are prepared solely for the information of the members of The Free Industrial Zone, Penang, Companies' Association (FREPENCA) ("the Association") and in accordance with FREPENCA's accounting policies stated below.

#### 2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### (a) Measurement Basis

The accounts are prepared using the historical cost basis unless indicated otherwise in other significant accounting policies.

#### (b) Receivables

Receivables are carried at the amount expected to be recovered. Known bad debts are written off and specific allowance is made for any debt considered to be doubtful of collection.

#### (c) Fixed Deposits and Cash At Bank

Fixed deposits and cash at bank are recognised and carried at cost.

#### (d) Payables and Accruals

Payables and accruals are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid for goods and services.

#### (e) Revenue Recognition

- (i) Income from subscriptions is recognised on accrual basis.
- (ii) Entrance fees are recognised on receipt basis.
- (iii) Interest on fixed deposit is on accrual basis using the effective interest method.

#### 3. OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSOCIATION

The principal objectives of the Association are to maintain and improve communications and relationships and disseminate information amongst its members in matters of mutual interest as well as with the government and its agencies.
